Unified Showing Information

Hello! My name is Allison Walbrecht and I am currently a sophomore at Lincoln Southwest High School. Here I participate in Unified Bowling, which pairs up students with special needs and peers throughout the school to then go bowl. Through this program I have seen kids come alive at the bowling alley and have made so many great friends and memories.

I was also born into a beef cattle operation, that I have always been interested in. Through this industry I have made great friends and have learned so much about myself and my surroundings.

Wanting a combine my passion of the livestock industry and helping the special needs community I created Unified Showing, a program that will allow youth with special needs to learn about and show livestock. Through this program I hope to provide an opportunity for someone who might otherwise not have access. I have personally seen how much a person can grow through \$-H, and helping those with special needs. With this program I hope to create safe space for both the showmen and buddies to grow.

I sincerely hope you consider being a part Unified Showing and help use grow into the best we all can be.

Unified Showing is a plot program that will be starting up this year. As this is the first year we will limit the number of showmen to just tow or three. By doing this it will allow us to fully understand the program and to devote our energy into doing this program and showmen justice.

The selected showman would need to join 4-H and the our very own 4-H club. This club will house both the showmen, the buddies, and adult leaders. We will also try to have 4_H meetings and hangouts once a month to ensure everyone feels comfortable and can make connections with other members. Parents and siblings will also be invited in order to form bonds with people who can better understand their experiences.

During the summer our showmen will come to the farm once a week and will practice with their lambs. These practices will be 45-75 minutes long and will include the showmen having the opportunity to lead their animals around, bathe them, feed them, and learn about them. Buddies, who will accompany the showmen into the show ring to ensure both the animal and child's safety, will be present and these practices. Family members will also be given the option of staying on site with their child or returning at the end of the practices.

At the End of the summer the showmen will be able to see their hard work pay off as they will have their own class at the Lancaster Country Super Fair. This class will be where they will lead their sheep around the ring with the help of their buddies. The judge will also ask them questions about their lamb and themselves. After this they will be given a prize for participating and working hard in Unified Showing.

The application process will begin January 1st, 2020 and end at midnight January 31st, 2020. The team will then be posted on the Unified Showing Facebook page on February 22nd, 2020.



Project Lifesaver



Lincoln has a resource for people who are prone to wandering. The Autism Family Network has launched "Project Lifesaver" as of October 1.





Project Lifesaver is a battery-operated band that a child or adult can wear. If the person is reported missing, a search and rescue team from the Lincoln Police Department and Lancaster County Sheriff's Department will respond with a tracking system.

Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies 911, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized

frequency to locate the position of the individual. The knowledge given from the community policing courses is best applied in this situation because the first responders will know how to best approach the client once found, and allow them to be brought back to safety.

Now, anyone can contact the Autism Family Network to sign up and be part of the program. The Project Lifesaver bracelet comes at a cost of \$300. Families can also choose to Pay As You Go and pay \$20 a month for 15 months until it's paid off. If families cannot afford either program, there are grants available for qualifying families.



In December 2014, the Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act was signed into law authorizing individuals with disabilities to open tax-exempt savings accounts to save for disability-related expenses without impacting eligibility for resource-based benefits. The Act permits individuals with disabilities to save more than a total of \$2,000 in assets (cash, savings, etc.) in their name in a qualified ABLE account.

The ABLE Act provides individuals with disabilities a host of benefits to start saving for the future. For starters, you get to keep your public benefits! And earnings on the money in your account are free from federal and state tax.

The DD Waiver is a voluntary waiver. It is not a federally mandated program. Therefore, the Nebraska State legislature determines how to fund the waiver. One of the determining criteria for funding is the number of persons on the DD waiver waiting list. People on the waitlist have already met eligibility guidelines and are waiting for services. Eligibility for the DD waiver is not dependent on your family's income.

On behalf of Autism Family Network, I encourage you to apply for the DD waiver. The legislature needs to be aware of the number of people with developmental delays in our state in order to fund the waiver appropriately. There will be a few years of waiting once your name is placed on the list. Don't let this discourage you. Your loved one will have to wait a few years for services regardless if you sign up today or in 5 years from now. Get your loved one's name on the list immediately to decrease the number of years he/she has to wait for services. Some services provided under the waiver include respite, daycare, rehabilitative care, and chore services.
